Project name	Mood of the Nation (Wave 23)	
Project reference	NGR 2203003	
Research dates:	29 <sup>th</sup> October - 3 <sup>rd</sup> November 2025	
Target population:	The target population for the research was Australian residents (all states and territories) aged 18+.	
Research methodology:	The research comprised of a 20-minute self-complete online survey with n=1,208 participants, sourced from an ISO accredited market research panel.	
Weighting approach:	The data was weighted using ABS Census population statistics on age, gender, location and occupation to match the estimated population of all Australian residents aged 18+. The total effective sample size after weighting was approximately 79%, equating to a margin of error of approximately +-3.2% (at the 95% confidence interval).	
Research questions:	A combination of single choice, multiple choice and open-ended (text response) questions were used in the research. All questions and response options were displayed in full during interviews.
